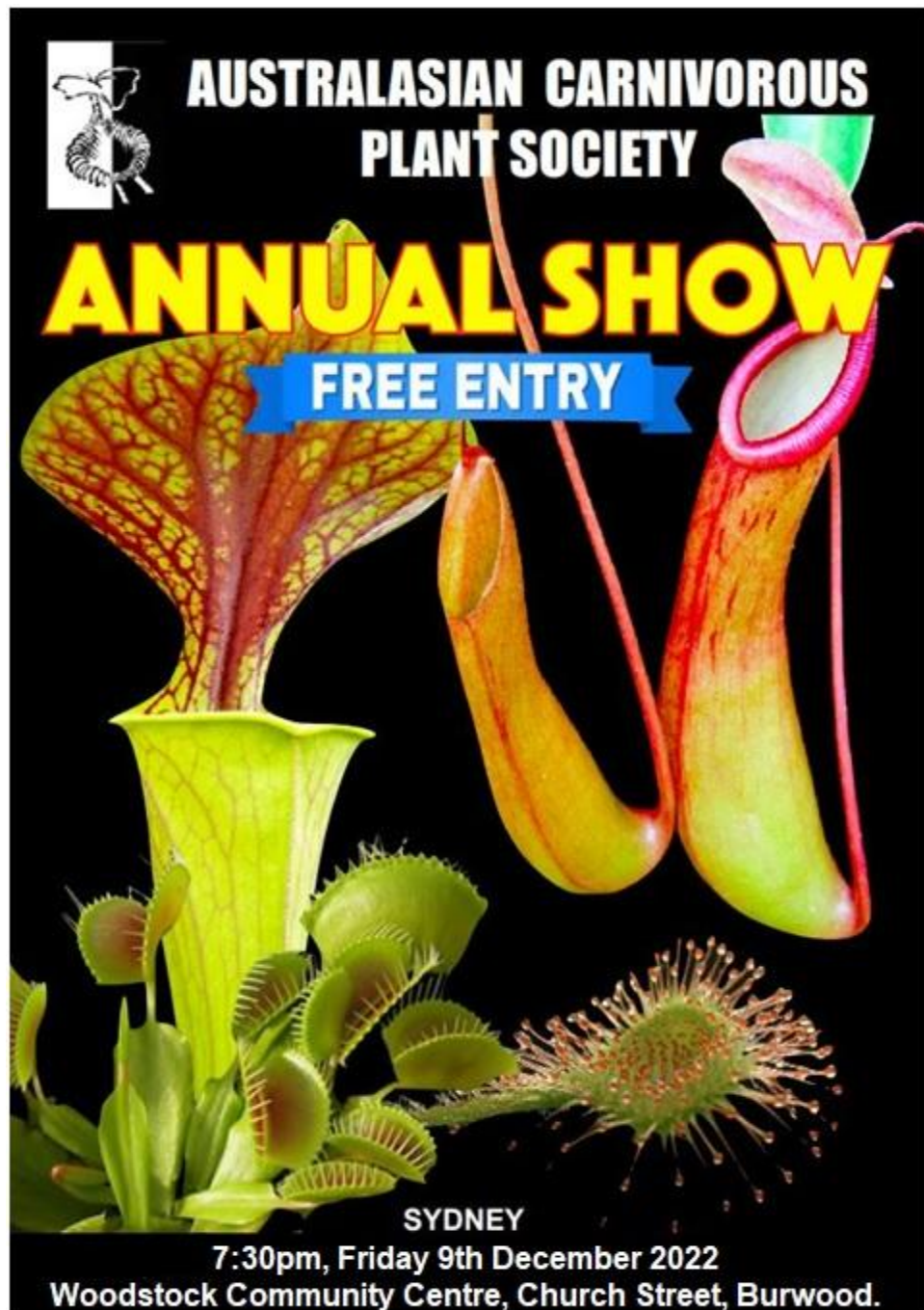
Our webinars will be recorded. They will be posted on the ICPS's social media (FB + YouTube) accounts about a week after the events.

MEETINGS

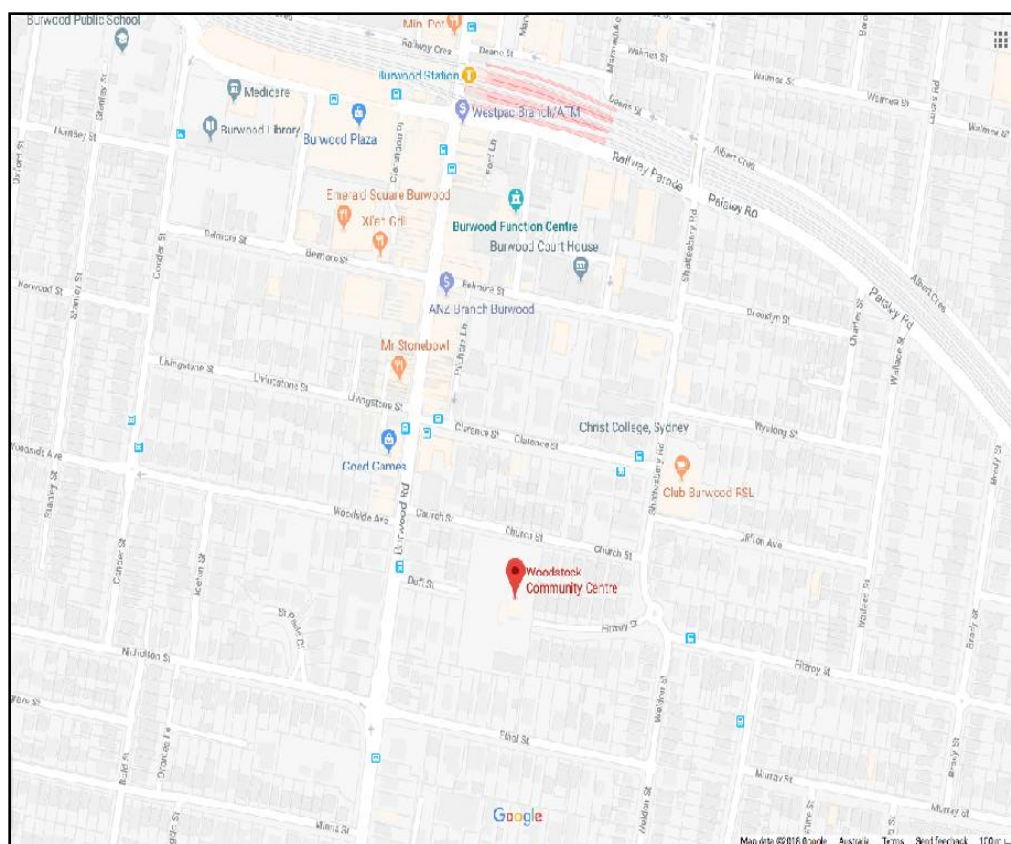

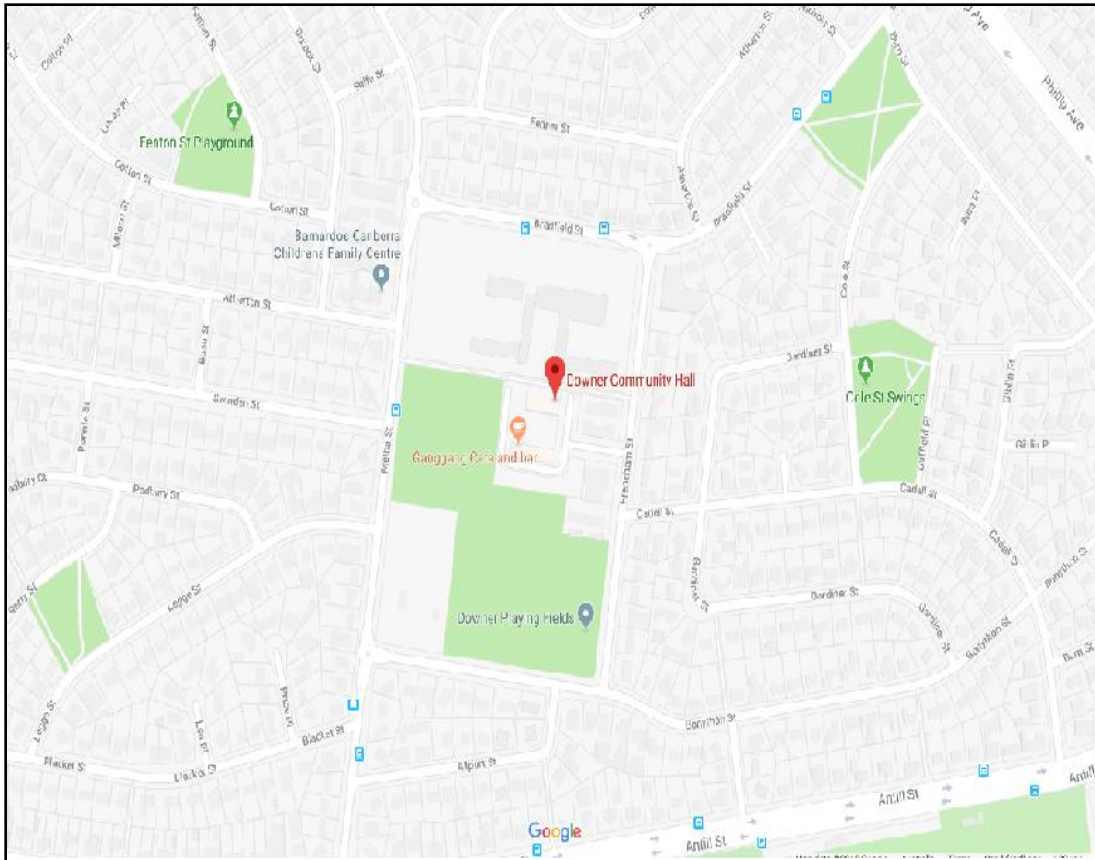


BRISBANE

4. The Christmas annual show will be next month, the 9th of December 2023. Come one and come all.

GENERAL BUSINESS

1. The second edition of the Blue Mountains CP guide should be available in 2023.
2. The Woodstock room hire has been paid for today via cheque, booked up to the end of 2023. For the December meet, we'll hire an extra hour for the annual show. David suggested if this years annual show goes well, the committee would consider a day show on the Saturday.
3. Robert of the Canberra chapter has organised the Australian National Botanic Gardens bookshop to carry the Field Guide of Canberra/Snowy Mountains' Carnivorous Plants, as well as at their Canberra meetings. Glenn will continue to announce the news via our newsletter.
4. Correspondence with our Canberra branch and the society's Vice President, President, Treasurer and other committee members are finalising matters:
 - * Update our constitution, via a Zoom meeting if necessary. We have a draft constitution. Both Robert and Kirk have had a cursory look over it and approve of it.
 - * Consider upgrading our website to make it more attractive.
 - * How should we approach the matter of electronic sales at plant fetes?
5. Collector's Plant Fair enrolment for April 15th and 16th of 2023. Kirk and Robert believe that a bigger stall would work better for our society, the Stall E option. For only \$230 more, we may secure the largest space available of 50 square metres. 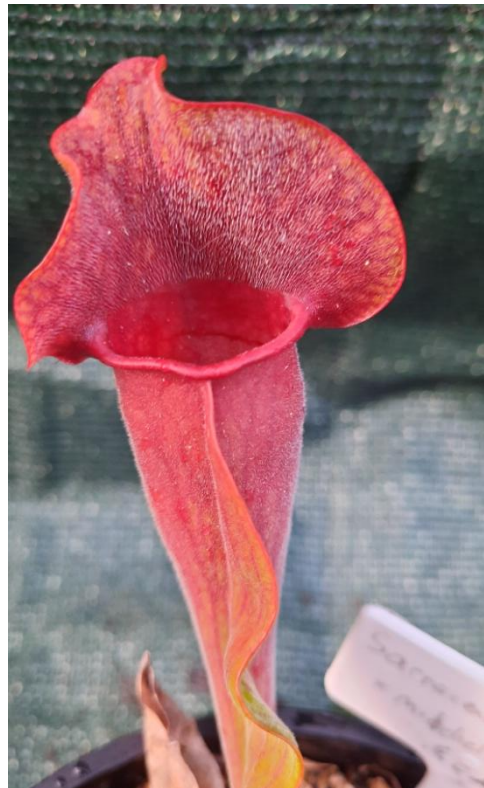

IN THE GREENHOUSE

ALDROVANDA

Plants are in active growth. Consider adding fresh decomposing leaf litter to the water to add CO₂. Keep frogs and tadpoles out of the water, as they may eat the plants. Plants may be grown in shade to reduce algae growth.

BROCCHINIA / CATOPSIS

Maintain high light levels and humidity. Protect from frost. Feed with 1/4 strength urea free liquid fertiliser every 4 weeks or so.

BYBLIS

Byblis gigantea and *lamellata* will be in full growth. Flowering begins. Cross pollinate flowers using the “Buzz” technique. Keep the soil moist.

The northern annual species of *Byblis* may be sown now. Germination commences when temperatures regularly reach 30°C. Artificial heat and/or smoke/GA3 treatment will induce germination.

CEPHALOTUS

Keep the soil moist but well drained. Avoid fungal problems by keeping good air movement around the plants. Flowering occurs in mid to late Spring.

DARLINGTONIA

Darlingtonia are in growth and flower. Keep moist and expose to cold temperatures for as long as possible. Stratified seed will begin to germinate.

DIONAEA

All VFTs are in active growth with fresh leaves and flowers. Consider removing the flower spike and use in vegetative propagation.

DROSERA

Tuberous *Drosera* begin their dormancy with most species becoming dormant with the warmer weather. Reduce watering.

Pygmy *Drosera* will begin to flower as temperatures increase. Keep plants moist to wet.

Other Winter growing species such as *D. ramentacea*, *cistiflora* and *pauciflora* will begin to enter dormancy. Reduce watering.

Tropical and sub-tropical species will be in growth. Keep protected from frost.

Temperate *Drosera* such as *D. filiformis*, *D. intermedia* and *D. rotundifolia* will end their dormancy and begin to grow and flower.

DROSOPHYLLUM

Drosophyllum will be in active growth and requires frequent feeding. In the absence of insect prey, a 1/4 strength urea free liquid fertiliser applied to the leaves is fine. *Drosophyllum* tolerates higher soil moisture levels during the cooler months and may be watered using the tray method. As temperatures increase, reduce watering and keep the soil just moist. Flowering commences in Spring. Flowers are self fertile.

GENLISEA

Genlisea should be in flower and active growth. Keep the water levels high. Keep warm and protect from frost.

HELIAMPHORA

Keep plants in a bright and humid location. Light levels may be increased with the cooler nights. Feed with 1/4 strength urea free liquid fertiliser.

NEPENTHES

Spring is a great time for *Nepenthes*. Aim to keep the lowland plants above 15°C. Spotting of the leaves is a sign of temperatures being too low. Highland species enjoy the cooler nights and will continue to grow. Keep plants above 5°C.

PINGUICULA

Most Mexican species/hybrids are dormant. Look out for the Summer carnivorous leaves in the coming months. Keep the soil drier until growth resumes. Some of the non-carnivorous leaves may be removed for leaf cuttings.

Warm-temperate species such as *P. primuliflora* and *lusitanica* will continue growth. Flowering occurs in the Spring. Keep the water up to *P. primuliflora* and take leaf cuttings.

RORIDULA

Roridula is in active growth. Flowering occurs in winter and spring. Sow seed now onto moist peat/sand. Germination may take 3-8 weeks. Keep the soil moist and place in very bright situations. Ensure good air circulation to avoid fungal attack of the seedlings.

SARRACENIA

All *Sarracenia* species/hybrids are in active growth. *Sarracenia flava* and *oreophila* species look their best in spring. Keep water level up and keep in full sun.

UTRICULARIA

Most terrestrial *Utricularia* will be in active growth and flower. Keep moist to wet.

Aquatic *Utricularia* will resume growth.

Winter growing species, such as *U. multifida* and *U. menziesii* will begin to end their growing cycle and go dormant as temperatures increase and soils dry out.

Tropical *Utricularia* - Maintain higher temperatures, humidity and air movement. Keep soil moist.

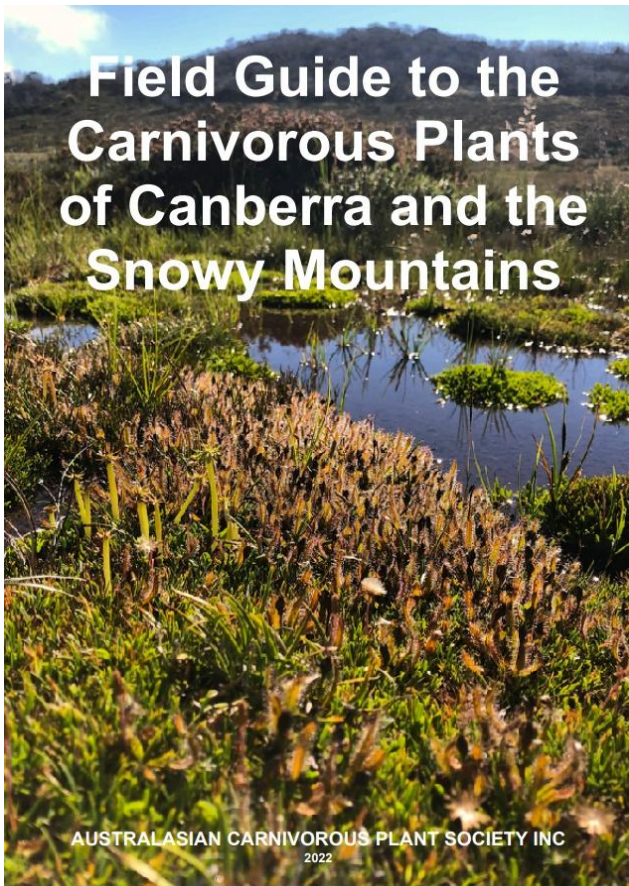
SEED BANK

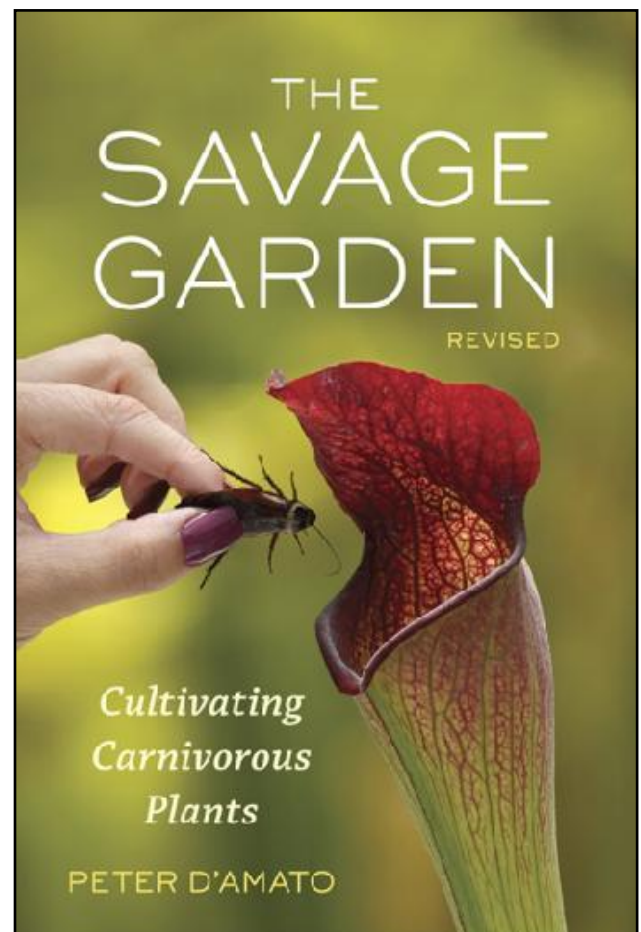
FIELD GUIDE TO THE CARNIVOROUS PLANTS OF CANBERRA AND THE SNOWY MOUNTAINS
