AUSTRALASIAN CARNIVOROUS PLANT SOCIETY INCORPORATED

CONSTITUTION/RULES

1 Name

The name of the association shall be "Australasian Carnivorous Plant Society Incorporated" (referred to in these rules as "the Society").

2 Objects

The objects of the Society shall be:

- a) To promote the cultivation and propagation of carnivorous plants.
- b) To conserve carnivorous plants in their natural habitat.
- c) To promote and contribute to the scientific and cultural knowledge of carnivorous plants.
- d) To produce and preserve literature relating to carnivorous plants.
- e) To create public interest in carnivorous plants and engage in activities that further the wellbeing and increase the knowledge of carnivorous plants.

3 Membership

- a) Subject to these rules the members of the Society shall be the members of the Australasian Carnivorous Plant Society immediately prior to incorporation.
- b) Membership shall be open to all individuals who accept the objectives and rules of the Society.
- c) The committee may refuse membership to any person and are not required to supply any reason for accepting or rejecting an application for membership.
- d) Members shall pay such fees as are determined by the Society at a general meeting.
- e) Membership fees shall fall due on the first day of each financial year of the Society.
- f) The financial year of the Society shall run from 1 January to 31 December or such other period as is determined by the committee.
- g) A register of members shall be kept by the Society showing the name, address and date of commencement and cessation of membership.
- h) Membership shall cease upon resignation, expulsion, or failure to pay outstanding membership fees within three months of the due date.

4 Member's Liability

The liability of a member of the Society to contribute toward the payment of the debts and liabilities of the Society or the costs, charges and expenses of the winding up of the Society is limited to the amount of any unpaid membership fees.

5 Disciplining of members

- a) A member may be expelled from membership of the Society (or otherwise disciplined) by the committee if, in the opinion of the committee after affording the member an opportunity of offering an explanation of his or her conduct, the conduct is regarded as being detrimental to the interests of the Society.
- b) A member may appeal against a decision expelling or otherwise disciplining him or her by notifying the committee in writing that he or she wishes the decision to be reviewed at the next general meeting of the Society.

6 Disputes between members

Disputes between members (in their capacity as members) of the Society, and disputes between members and the Society, shall be referred to a community justice centre for mediation in accordance with the *Community Justice Centres Act 1983*.

7 Committee

- a) The Society shall have its affairs controlled and managed by a committee (referred to in these rules as "the committee") consisting of the office bearers.
- b) The office bearers shall be a President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary and Membership Secretary and up to one other member, to whom specific duties may be delegated by the committee.
- c) The office bearers and other members of the committee shall be elected at each annual general meeting from among the financial members. The election of the committee shall be conducted by a Returns Officer appointed by the annual general meeting. Any casual vacancy occurring in the committee may be filled by a member appointed by the committee.
- d) Each member of the committee shall hold office from the date of their election or appointment until the next annual general meeting.
- e) Retiring committee members are eligible for re-election, providing:
 - I. A member shall not serve on the committee for more than nine consecutive years.
 - II. A member shall not hold the office of President for more than four consecutive years.
- f) A member of the committee shall cease to hold office upon resignation in writing or removal as a member of the Society.
- g) The committee shall meet as often as necessary to conduct the business of the Society.
- h) Notice of committee meetings shall be given at the previous committee meeting or by such other means as the committee shall decide.
- i) The quorum for meetings of the committee shall be one half of the number of committee members elected at the previous annual general meeting.
- j) Questions arising at any meeting of the committee shall be decided by the majority of votes of those present. In case of the equality of votes the person appointed to chair the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

8 Office bearer responsibilities

- a) The President and Vice president shall be responsible for the general running of the Society and may, if needed, simultaneously assume other office bearer responsibilities.
- b) The Secretary unless another person is so appointed by the Committee is responsible for the incoming and outgoing business correspondence for the Society. Including but not limited to reading emails and letters, and mail out of journals. The Secretary shall ensure that records of the Constitution/Rules of the Society and minutes of all general and committee meetings are kept. These records shall be available for inspection by any member and shall be held in the custody of the Secretary.
- c) The Membership Secretary is automatically appointed as Public Officer unless another person is so appointed by the Committee and shall ensure that the register of members is kept up to date. Membership records shall be available for inspection by any member and shall be held in the custody of the Membership Secretary.
- d) The Treasurer shall ensure that all money received by the Society is paid into a bank account in the Society's name which may have sub-accounts for regional parts of the Society or as agreed by the Committee. Payments shall be made and received through a petty cash system or via electronic funds transfer (EFT) or via "credit card tap technology" authorised by the committee. Major or unusual expenses shall be authorised in advance by the committee or a general meeting.
- e) The Treasurer shall ensure that correct books and accounts are kept showing the financial affairs of the Society. These records shall be available for inspection by any member and shall be held in the custody of the treasurer.

9 Public officer

- a) The committee shall appoint a member as Public Officer, provided such person is over 18 years of age. The Public Officer may be removed by the committee and a new Public Officer appointed.
- b) The Public Officer shall make all necessary notifications to the Department of Fair Trading in compliance with the *Associations Incorporation Act 1984*, any successor legislation or as required in the States and Territories of Australia.

- c) The Public Officer shall keep a register of members of the committee which must contain the name and residential address of each committee member and the date on which they became a member of the committee and be updated within one month of any change taking place.

10 General meetings

- a) An annual general meeting of the Society shall be held each year within six months from the end of the financial year of the Society.
- b) At each annual general meeting the following business shall be transacted:
 - I. receipt of the committee's report on the activities of the Society in the last financial year;
 - II. receipt and consideration of the financial statement from the committee which is required to be submitted to members under section 26 (6) of the Associations Incorporation Act 1984;
 - III. election of office bearers and other members of the committee.
- c) An ordinary general meeting shall be held each month or at such other frequency as determined by the committee.
- d) The committee may, whenever it thinks fit, convene a special general meeting of the Society.
- e) A special general meeting must be convened by the committee within one month of receiving a written request to do so from at least five (5) percent of the membership of the Society.
- f) Members shall be given at least 14 days written notice, in the Society's newsletter, journal or otherwise, delivered personally or by post of all general meetings and notices of motion.
- g) The quorum for a general meeting shall be five members present in person.
- h) The President, or in the President's absence the Vice-President, or in the absence of the President and Vice-President, such member elected by the meeting, shall preside as chairperson at the meeting.
- i) Each member is entitled to one vote, exercised personally or by proxy, on each resolution submitted.
- j) Voting at general meetings shall be by show of hands unless a secret ballot is demanded. Decisions shall be made by a simple majority vote except for special resolutions.

11 Special resolutions

- a) A special resolution must be passed by a general meeting of the Society to effect the following :
 - I. a change of the Society's name;
 - II. a change of the Society's rules;
 - III. a change of the Society's objects;
 - IV. an amalgamation with another incorporated association;
 - V. to voluntarily wind up the Society and distribute its property.
- b) A special resolution shall be passed in the following manner:
 - I. at least 21 days prior to the meeting a notice must be given to all members advising that a general meeting is to be held to consider a special resolution and giving details of the proposed special resolution;
 - II. a quorum must be present at the meeting;
 - III. at least three-quarters of the valid vote must be in favour of the resolution.

12 Miscellaneous

- a) The Society shall effect and maintain insurance as required under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1984*, together with any other insurance required by law or regarded as necessary by the Society.
- b) The funds of the Society shall be derived from membership fees, journal and plant sales, donations, grants and such other sources as may be approved by the Society.
- c) The common seal of the Society shall be kept in the custody of the Public Officer and shall only be affixed to a document with the approval of the committee. The stamping of the common seal shall be witnessed by the signatures of two members of the committee.
- d) The income and property of the Society shall be used only for the promotion of the objects of the Society and shall not be paid or transferred to members by way of dividend, bonus or profit.
- e) In the event that the Society should be wound up or have its incorporation cancelled any surplus property shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Society but shall be given or transferred to such other associations or institutions having objects similar to some or all of the objects of the Society.

SEEDBANK

The current list of seeds in the Seedbank is very large. Rather than bring it to every meeting, which can be difficult, it is recommended that seeds are ordered via email. After payment has been received the specific order can be brought along to the meetings or posted in the normal way.

MEETINGS

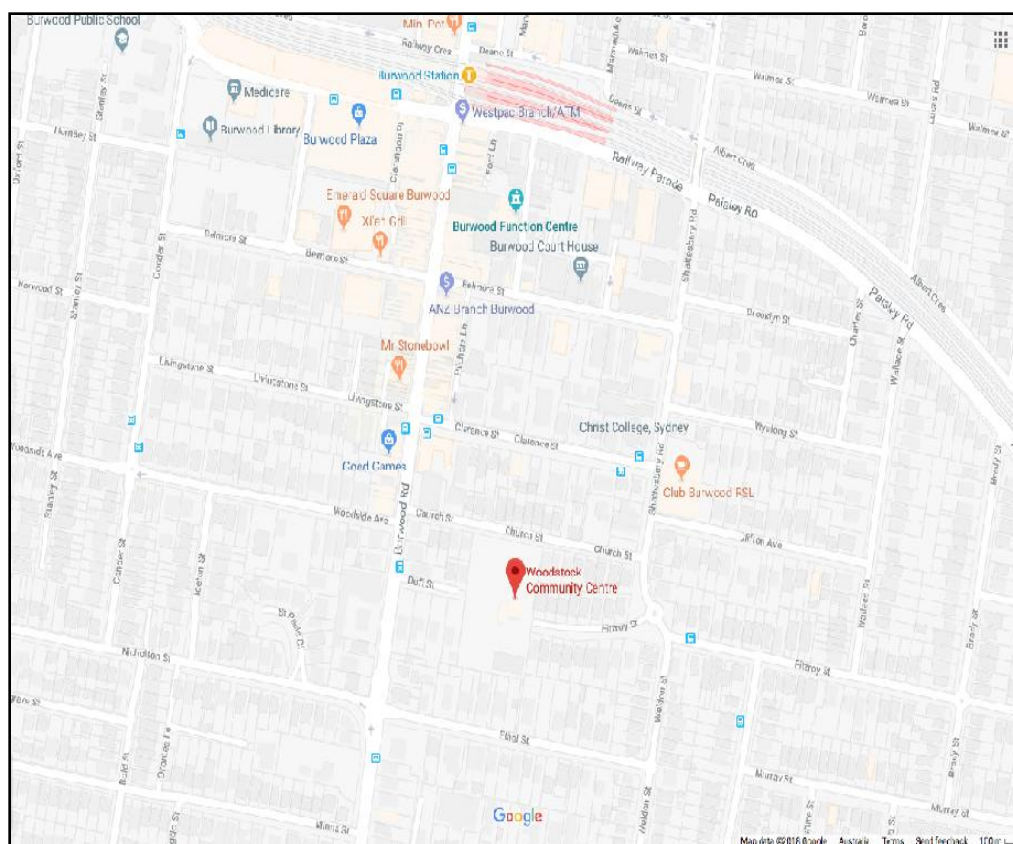

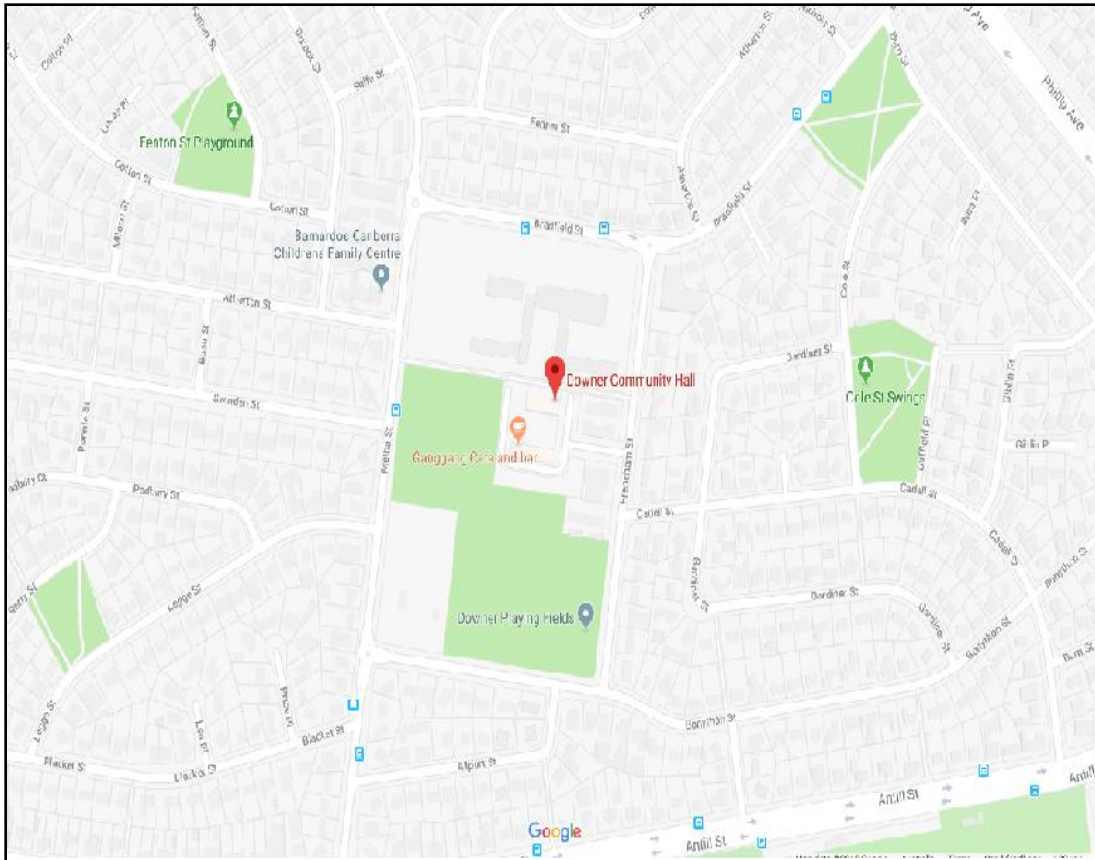

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the previous meeting of 12th January, 2023 were not tabled at this meeting. But will be at the following meeting so they may be accepted as a true record of that event.

BUSINESS ARISING / GENERAL BUSINESS

- 1) The March issue of *Carniflora Australis* is being prepared but is short on content. Therefore, this is a call for members to provide a contribution. See the newsletter and September 2022 issue of *Carniflora Australis* for details on how to make a submission.
- 2) The February newsletter included proposed draft updated constitution for the Society. This includes splitting the role of the membership secretary to make a new committee position and to change how the society can undertake financial transactions. There will be a general discussion on the proposed changes at the March meeting.

- 3) The Royal Easter Show is coming up with the carnivorous plant competition to be held on the 6th and 7th of April, 2023. There are 8 categories in the competition. Entries close 1st March. Entering the competition enables you to enter as many plants as you like. More details are in the February newsletter. There is also a call out for a member to give the talk on carnivorous plants at the show. The presentation is already prepared.
- 4) The Collectors' Plant Fair at Clarendon will be held on the weekend of the 15th and 16th of April, 2023. The Society has been notified that we will be allocated a smaller stall area than last year. Therefore, we will be pre-allocating space to members who will be selling plants. This will be discussed at the March meeting. There are a number of items of the Society currently with Fuzzy, such as the cash box – he will bring them to the March meeting.
- 5) The Society has been invited to participate in the Southern Highlands Botanical Garden Autumn Plant Fair, which will be held on the weekend of the 22nd and 23rd of April, 2023. This is the weekend after the Collectors' Plant Fair and may be too ambitious for Sydney-based members to attend. However, members in the Canberra chapter of the Society may wish to attend. Fuzzy has forwarded details of the event to Robert Little.
- 6) Wollondilly Shire Council is putting on a plant fair and garden expo on the 30th of October, 2023 at the Picton Botanic Gardens on Regreme Road, Picton. The fees for a stall are quite reasonable. Fuzzy has placed details of the event in the society's g-mail account, under the 'Events' folder. Would our society like to attend next year? *Sarracenia* are looking good by that month? It could be a new event to add to our society's calendar.
- 7) The Carnivorous Plant Society, London has invited members of the Australasian Carnivorous Plant Society to participate in a questionnaire to develop growing tips for carnivorous plants for an on-line gardening publication. The questionnaire is being organised by Ms Mollie Brown. - 8) Jeff Williams has offered to give a talk on carnivorous plants at the following venues. The Willoughby Garden Club, 12th April, The Tropical garden Society, 23rd May and The Vacluse Garden Club, 19th July. Thanks Jeff.
- 9) It is proposed to move the Annual Show this year from the Friday afternoon to the following Saturday, that is, the 9th of December, 2023. This would enable more people to attend the event.

The winner of **Plant of the Month** was *Drosera curviscapa* grown by David Colbourn. The plant was obtained through the Victorian Carnivorous Plant Society. It is grown in a tall black pot in a mix of about equal parts peat moss and sand. It is kept in a tray of water at a depth of between 1 and 10 cm and the plant receives bright light during the day. The plants are not fed, and also do not set seed.

Other plants:

A large *Nepenthes truncata* x *ventricosa*, grown by Oliver, was also on show.

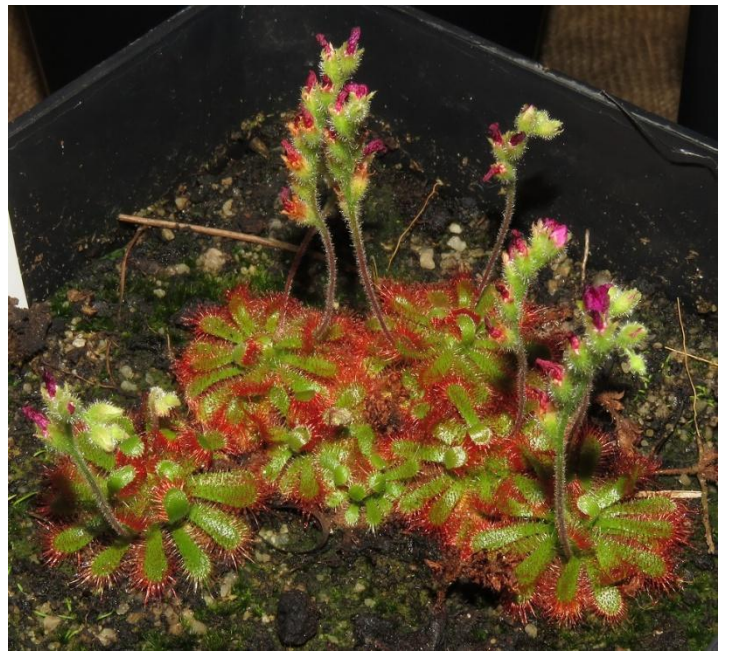
The meeting closed at 8:45 p.m. The next meeting will be on Friday, 10th of March, 2023. 'Plant of the Month' will be *Pinguicula*.

IN THE GREENHOUSE

ALDROVANDA

Plants are in active growth. Consider adding fresh decomposing leaf litter to the water to add CO₂. Keep frogs and tadpoles out of the water, as they may eat the plants. Plants will divide rapidly. Plants may be grown in shade to reduce algae growth.

BROCCHINIA / CATOPSIS

Maintain high light levels and humidity. Water from above. Feed with 1/4 strength urea free liquid fertiliser every 4 weeks or so.

BYBLIS

Byblis gigantea and *B. lamellata* are naturally dormant over summer but may be kept in growth with constant soil moisture. Keep the soil moist to wet. Flowering continues. Harvest seed.

The northern annual species of *Byblis* will now be in active growth. Growth rates will be higher in hot and humid conditions. Cross pollinate the flowers to ensure seed set.

Growth rates for all species of *Byblis* may be accelerated with increased prey capture or fertilisation. Place some rotting fruit around the plants or sprinkle granulated fish food onto the leaves. Pollinate the flowers using the “buzz” technique.

CEPHALOTUS

Keep the soil moist but well drained. Avoid fungal problems by keeping good air movement around the plants.

DARLINGTONIA

Darlingtonia will be in active growth. Stolons will begin growing under the substrate. Watch out for hot days. Place your plants in more shade or consider bringing them indoors during hot weather. Night temperatures are high so it is imperative that the roots are kept cool.

DIONAEA

All VFTs should be in active growth. Many varieties will begin to produce upright petioles and traps, a strategy to compete with surrounding vegetation. Keep well watered.

DROSERA

Tuberous *Drosera* are dormant and will soon break dormancy. Ensure your repotting is done this month. Keep the pots barely moist.

Pygmy *Drosera* are dormant over summer and survive with the production of white stipule buds to reflect the sun and absorb the morning dew. Plants may be kept moister to keep in active growth.

Other Winter growing species such as *D. cistiflora* and *D. pauciflora* are still dormant. Reduce watering and keep the pots barely moist.

Tropical and subtropical species will be in full growth and flower. Keep the soil very moist. Collect seed and sow onto a peat based media.

Temperate *Drosera* such as *D. filiformis*, *D. intermedia* and *D. rotundifolia* will be in active growth and flower. Seed pods will be maturing, harvest seed.

DROSOPHYLLUM

Drosophyllum will be in active growth. Flowering commences in spring and continues into summer. Flowers are self fertile. Harvest seed. Avoid hot and humid conditions. Growth rates increase with increased prey capture.

GENLISEA

Genlisea should be in flower and active growth. Keep the water levels high with these species.

HELIAMPHORA

Keep plants in a bright and very humid location. Avoid temperatures over 30°C. Fertilise with a diluted foliar application of urea free fertiliser every 2-4 weeks.

NEPENTHES

Some *Nepenthes* struggle over the Australian summer. Aim to keep the lowland plants warm to hot and in high humidity. Highland species require cooler nights. Mist in the afternoon to reduce air temperatures and increase humidity.

PINGUICULA

Mexican species/hybrids are in active growth. Keep the soil moist and humidity high.

Warm temperate species such as *P. primuliflora* and *P. lusitanica* will continue growth. Keep the water up to *P. primuliflora* and take leaf cuttings.

RORIDULA

Roridula is in active growth. Flowering ends. Harvest any seed. Keep the soil moist and place in a very bright and airy situation with low humidity.

SARRACENIA

All *Sarracenia* species/hybrids are in active growth. Keep well watered and in full sun. *S. flava* and *S. oreophila* will produce non-carnivorous phyllodia. *S. leucophylla* and *S. rubra* will produce larger and more upright pitchers. They look their best in autumn.

UTRICULARIA

Most terrestrial *Utricularia* will be in active growth and flower. Keep moist to wet.

Aquatic *Utricularia* are in active growth. Keep algae under control.

Winter growing species, such as *U. multifida* and *U. menziesii* are still dormant. Keep the soil barely moist.

Tropical *Utricularia* - Maintain higher temperatures, humidity and air movement. Keep soils moist.

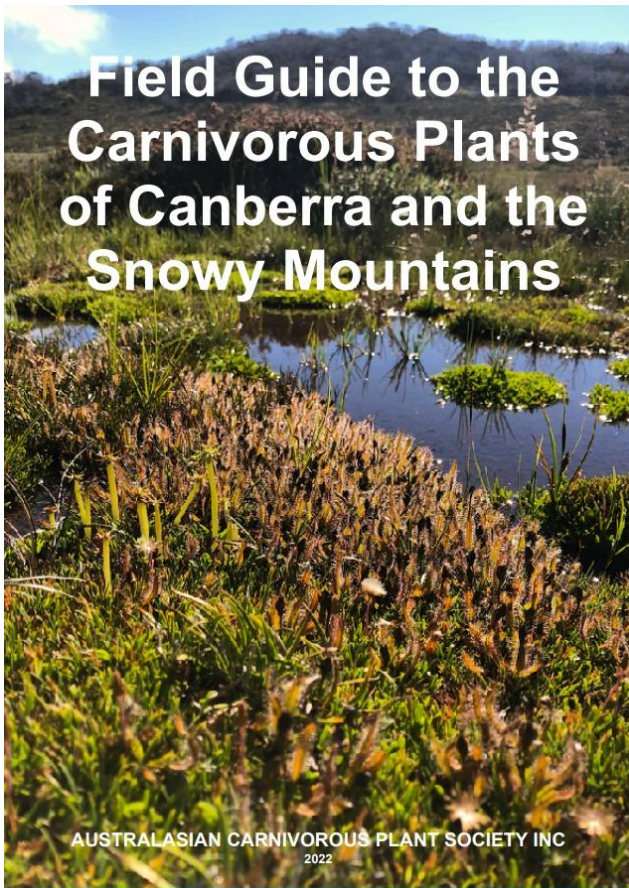
SEED BANK

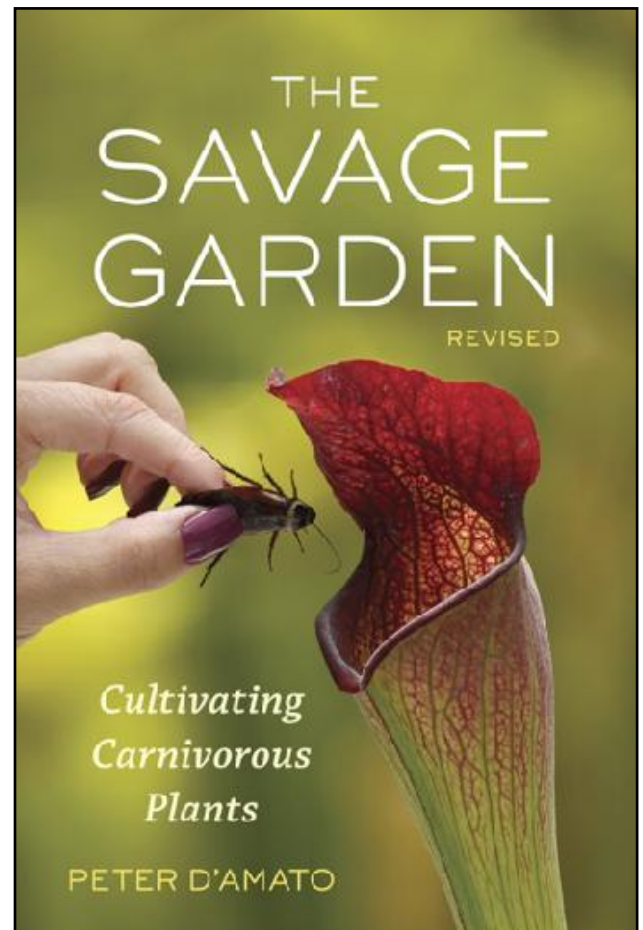
