## **MEETINGS**



We hope you can attend one of our meetings and enjoy the fellowship of other enthusiasts for these wonderful plants.





## BUSINESS ARISING

1. At the Kariong Plant Lovers Fair, two-thirds of the stock was sold on Saturday, attracting significant public interest. It served as an excellent promotional opportunity for the society, given our longstanding relationship with the plant fair. We plan to maintain our presence with a stall at next year's event.
2. The Orchid Central Show experienced a calm day in terms of interest and sales for carnivorous plants, which was anticipated given the event's focus on orchids. It may be necessary to discuss the benefits of participating in future shows of a similar nature.
3. Bloom Festival – David has communicated his inability to attend this year. A discussion will be scheduled for next year to consider attendance.
4. The Summer Carnivorous Plant Show is scheduled for Saturday, December 14th. It will take place in the Fitzroy Hall, pending confirmation from Wesley. The event will run from 9 am to 3 pm, with setup available for exhibitors starting at 8 am. Lunch will be provided for delegates, volunteers, and committee members.

Exhibitors and sellers are requested to email Kirk, the membership secretary, to confirm their attendance. This will assist us with organising the event and estimating the number of participants. The categories will remain the same as last year: Sarracenia, Nepenthes, Drosera, Native, Dionaea, and Others. Voting for each category will be conducted using the bean system, and a Grand Champion will be selected through judging. The event continues to gain popularity with the public. Please note, there will be no meeting on Friday in December due to the show taking place the following night.

## IN THE GREENHOUSE

### **ALDROVANDA**

Plants are currently experiencing active growth. Consider adding fresh, decomposing leaf litter to the water to increase CO<sub>2</sub> levels. It is important to keep frogs and tadpoles away, as they may consume the plants. Growing plants in shaded areas can help minimize algae growth.

### **BROCCHINIA / CATOPSIS**

Ensure high light levels and humidity are maintained. Protect from frost. Feed with a 1/4 strength, urea-free liquid fertilizer approximately every four weeks.

### **BYBLIS**

Both **B. gigantea** and **B. lamellata** will be thriving and entering their flowering stage. Utilize the "Buzz" technique for cross-pollination. Keep the soil consistently moist.

Now is a good time to sow northern annual species of **Byblis**. Germination begins when temperatures regularly reach 30°C. Applying artificial heat and/or smoke/GA3 treatment can encourage germination.

### **CEPHALOTUS**

Keep the soil moist yet well-drained. To prevent fungal issues, ensure good air circulation around the plants. Flowering typically occurs from mid to late spring.

### **DARLINGTONIA**

**Darlingtonia** plants are actively growing and flowering. Maintain moisture and expose them to cold temperatures for as long as possible. Stratified seeds will begin germinating.

### **DIONAEA**

All Venus Flytraps are in active growth, producing fresh leaves and flowers. Consider removing the flower spike for vegetative propagation.

### **DROSERA**

Tuberous **Drosera** species are starting their dormancy, with most becoming dormant as the weather warms. Reduce watering.

Pygmy **Drosera** will begin to flower as temperatures rise. Keep these plants moist to wet.

Other winter-growing species, including **D. ramentacea**, **D. cistiflora** and **D. pauciflora**, will start entering dormancy. Reduce watering accordingly.

Tropical and subtropical species will be actively growing but should be protected from frost.

Temperate **Drosera** varieties such as **D. filiformis**, **D. intermedia** and **D. rotundifolia** will conclude their dormancy and begin flowering.

### **DROSOPHYLLUM**

**Drosophyllum** will be actively growing and requires frequent feeding. In the absence of insect prey, a 1/4 strength, urea-free liquid fertilizer can be applied to the leaves. **Drosophyllum** can tolerate higher soil moisture levels during cooler months and may be watered using the tray method. As temperatures rise, reduce watering to keep the soil just moist. Flowering will begin in spring, with flowers being self-fertile.

## GENLISEA

**Genlisea** should exhibit active growth and flowering. Maintain high water levels and keep warm while protecting from frost.

## HELIAMPHORA

Keep plants in a bright and humid environment. Light levels can be increased as the nights cool down. Feed with a 1/4 strength, urea-free liquid fertilizer.

## NEPENTHES

Spring is an ideal time for Nepenthes growth. Keep lowland plants above 15°C; leaf spotting indicates temperatures are too low. Highland species thrive in cooler nights and should be kept above 5°C.

## PINGUICULA

Most Mexican species and hybrids are currently dormant. Look for the return of summer carnivorous leaves in the upcoming months. Keep the soil drier until growth resumes. Some non-carnivorous leaves can be removed for leaf cuttings.

Warm-temperate species such as **P. primuliflora** and **P. lusitanica** will continue to grow, with flowering occurring in spring. Maintain adequate water levels for **P. primuliflora** and take leaf cuttings.

## RORIDULA

**Roridula** is actively growing, with flowering occurring in winter and spring. Sow seeds now onto moist peat/sand. Germination may take 3-8 weeks; keep the soil moist and place in very bright locations. Ensure good air circulation to prevent fungal attacks on seedlings.

## SARRACENIA

All **Sarracenia** species and hybrids are currently in active growth. **S. flava** and **S. oreophila** species look particularly vibrant in spring. Maintain water levels and ensure full sun exposure.

## UTRICULARIA

Most terrestrial **Utricularia** will be actively growing and flowering; keep these plants moist to wet. Aquatic **Utricularia** will also resume growth.

Winter-growing species like **U. multifida** and **U. menziesii** will start to end their growing cycle and go dormant as temperatures rise and soils dry out.

Tropical **Utricularia** should be kept at higher temperatures, with adequate humidity and air movement, while ensuring the soil remains moist.

## MERCHANDISE

### **CONTACT CARDS**

The Society produces a business sized card with all our contact details. The cards are free and available for collection from our meetings. Members and visitors are welcome to take a handful of cards to distribute to other Carnivorous Plant enthusiasts.

## POTTING MIXES






## THE SAVAGE GARDEN
