MEETINGS



We hope you can attend one of our meetings and enjoy the fellowship of other enthusiasts for these wonderful plants.


SYDNEY



MINUTES OF THE AUSTRALASIAN CARNIVOROUS PLANT SOCIETY INC.

HELD ON FRIDAY, 10TH OCTOBER, 2025

WOODSTOCK COMMUNITY CENTRE, CHURCH STREET, BURWOOD, NSW.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the previous meeting held on 12th September 2025 were tabled and accepted.

- **Kirk:** Accepted
- **Ian:** Seconded the motion.

BUSINESS ARISING / GENERAL BUSINESS

1. Spring Cactus Show

- **Date:** Saturday, 11th October
- **Location:** Hawkesbury Showground
- **Details:** This is a major event for cactus and succulent enthusiasts. The Spring Cactus Show is an opportunity for sellers, collectors, and hobbyists to gather and showcase their plants. Members and society representatives might be involved in setting up, volunteering, or assisting in the management of the event. This show will likely feature a variety of rare and common cactus species, alongside demonstrations, workshops, and sales.

2. Wollondilly Garden Expo & Plant Fair

- **Date:** Sunday, 9th November 2025
- **Location:** Picton Botanic Gardens (8 am – 2 pm)
- **Details:** The expo offers a variety of plants and garden-related products, with the main feature being a plant fair. Unfortunately, the society missed the application deadline for booking a selling area, which means we can't officially sell plants or goods at this event.

3. Australian Carniflora Journal

- **Status:** Final draft is in review. Kirk is the acting editor.

- **Details:** The **Carniflora Journal** is a significant publication for the society, focusing on carnivorous plant care, research, cultivation tips, and member contributions. The journal is in its final draft stage, meaning it's close to being ready for printing or digital distribution. Kirk, the current acting editor, is overseeing the review and final revisions.

4. Summer Show

- **Date:** Saturday, 13th December 2025
- **Location:** Fitzroy Hall (9 am – 3 pm)
- **Details:** This is a key event on the society's calendar, designed as a holiday-themed show featuring carnivorous plants. Sellers will be able to set up as early as 7:30 am, and the event runs throughout the day. The Summer Show may feature workshops, demonstrations, and competitions related to growing carnivorous plants.
- **Note:** There will be no regular AUSCPS (Australian Carnivorous Plant Society) meeting the night before (Friday, 12th December).

5. Change of PO Box

- **New PO Box:** PO Box 1165, Burwood North NSW 2134
- **Details:** The society's previous PO Box (PO Box 70) has been closed, and a mail redirection service is now in place for six months. This is important for members, stakeholders, and external parties to know, as they may be sending payments, applications, or correspondence to the old address. The new address is also reflected on membership forms and in the Carniflora Journal.
- **Suggestion:** It's been proposed that flyers announcing the new PO Box be inserted into the journal when mailed to overseas societies, ensuring everyone is aware of the change.

6. Plant Guides

- **Adelaide Guide:** Published
- **Sydney Guide:** Sold out; revision in progress for reprint
- **Brisbane Guide:** In preparation for publication in 2026
- **Details:** The society publishes regional plant guides, which are key resources for plant care and identification. The Adelaide guide has already been completed and released. The Sydney guide has been very popular but is sold out, so a revision is underway to update or print more copies. The Brisbane guide is also in development and is expected to be ready for 2026. These guides may include plant care tips, local growing conditions, and recommendations for carnivorous plants.

7. ICPS International Conference 2026

The International Cactus and Succulent Plant Society (ICPS) is hosting its 2026 conference in the Netherlands. This conference will be a global event, bringing together enthusiasts, experts, and organizations to share knowledge and insights on carnivorous plant care. Details will be published in the newsletter, so members can begin planning if they wish to attend.

8. New Logo

Marlon is tasked with providing several logo options in both colour and black/white formats. The committee will review these options and narrow it down to three choices of each for members to

vote on. This new logo will help refresh the society's branding, giving it a modern and cohesive look.

9. Room Setup Request

An email from Burwood Council requests that any room used for society meetings or events be left in a tidy condition. Specifically, chairs and tables should be stacked neatly in the back holding area. This is a reminder to ensure the venue is left in good condition after meetings or events to maintain a positive relationship with the council.

10. Website Update Working Party

There's a need to update the society's website and hosting services. A working party will be formed to evaluate potential improvements, including a refreshed design, better user experience, and possibly more interactive features. Updating the website could include a better interface for membership renewals, event registrations, and publication access. There may also be considerations for modern hosting solutions that ensure faster load times and improved security.



In the Greenhouse: Seasonal Care Guide

Aldrovanda

- Plants are actively growing.
- Add fresh, decomposing leaf litter to boost CO₂ levels in the water.
- Keep frogs and tadpoles away—they may eat the plants.
- Shade helps reduce algae growth.

Brocchinia / Catopsis

- Maintain high light and humidity.
- Protect from frost.
- Feed monthly with 1/4 strength, urea-free liquid fertilizer.

Byblis

- *B. gigantea* and *B. lamellata* are flowering—use the “Buzz” technique for cross-pollination.
- Keep soil consistently moist.
- Sow northern annual species now; germination begins at 30°C.
- Use artificial heat, smoke, or GA₃ to encourage sprouting.

Cephalotus

- Keep soil moist but well-drained.
- Ensure good air circulation to prevent fungal issues.
- Expect flowering from mid to late spring.

Darlingtonia

- Actively growing and flowering.
- Maintain moisture and expose to cold as long as possible.
- Stratified seeds will begin germinating.

Dionaea (Venus Flytrap)

- Producing fresh leaves and flowers.
- Remove flower spikes to promote vegetative growth.

Drosera

- **Tuberous species:** Entering dormancy—reduce watering.
- **Pygmy species:** Beginning to flower—keep moist to wet.
- **Winter growers** (e.g., *D. ramentacea*, *D. cistiflora*, *D. pauciflora*): Starting dormancy—reduce watering.
- **Tropical/subtropical species:** Actively growing—protect from frost.
- **Temperate species** (e.g., *D. filiformis*, *D. intermedia*, *D. rotundifolia*): Ending dormancy—beginning to flower.

Drosophyllum

- Actively growing—feed regularly.
- If no insect prey, apply $\frac{1}{4}$ strength, urea-free liquid fertilizer to leaves.
- Tolerates wetter soil in cool months; use tray method.
- As temperatures rise, reduce watering.
- Spring flowering; flowers are self-fertile.

Genlisea

- Growing and flowering actively.
- Maintain high water levels and warmth.
- Protect from frost.

Heliamphora

- Bright, humid conditions are ideal.
- Increase light as nights cool.
- Feed with $\frac{1}{4}$ strength, urea-free liquid fertilizer.

Nepenthes

- Spring is prime growth time.
- **Lowland species:** Keep above 15°C—leaf spotting signals cold stress.
- **Highland species:** Prefer cool nights—keep above 5°C.

Pinguicula

- **Mexican species/hybrids:** Dormant—keep soil drier until carnivorous leaves return.
- Remove non-carnivorous leaves for cuttings.
- **Warm-temperate species** (e.g., *P. primuliflora*, *P. lusitanica*): Continue growing and flowering—maintain water levels and take cuttings.

Roridula

- Actively growing; flowering in winter and spring.
- Sow seeds on moist peat/sand now.
- Germination takes 3–8 weeks—keep bright and moist.
- Ensure good airflow to prevent fungal issues.

Sarracenia

- All species and hybrids are actively growing.
- *S. flava* and *S. oreophila* are especially vibrant in spring.
- Maintain water levels and full sun exposure.

Utricularia

- **Terrestrial species:** Growing and flowering—keep moist to wet.
- **Aquatic species:** Resuming growth.
- **Winter growers** (e.g., *U. multifida*, *U. menziesii*): Entering dormancy—reduce watering.
- **Tropical species:** Require warmth, humidity, and moist soil with good air movement.

POTTING MIXES






THE SAVAGE GARDEN
