MEETINGS

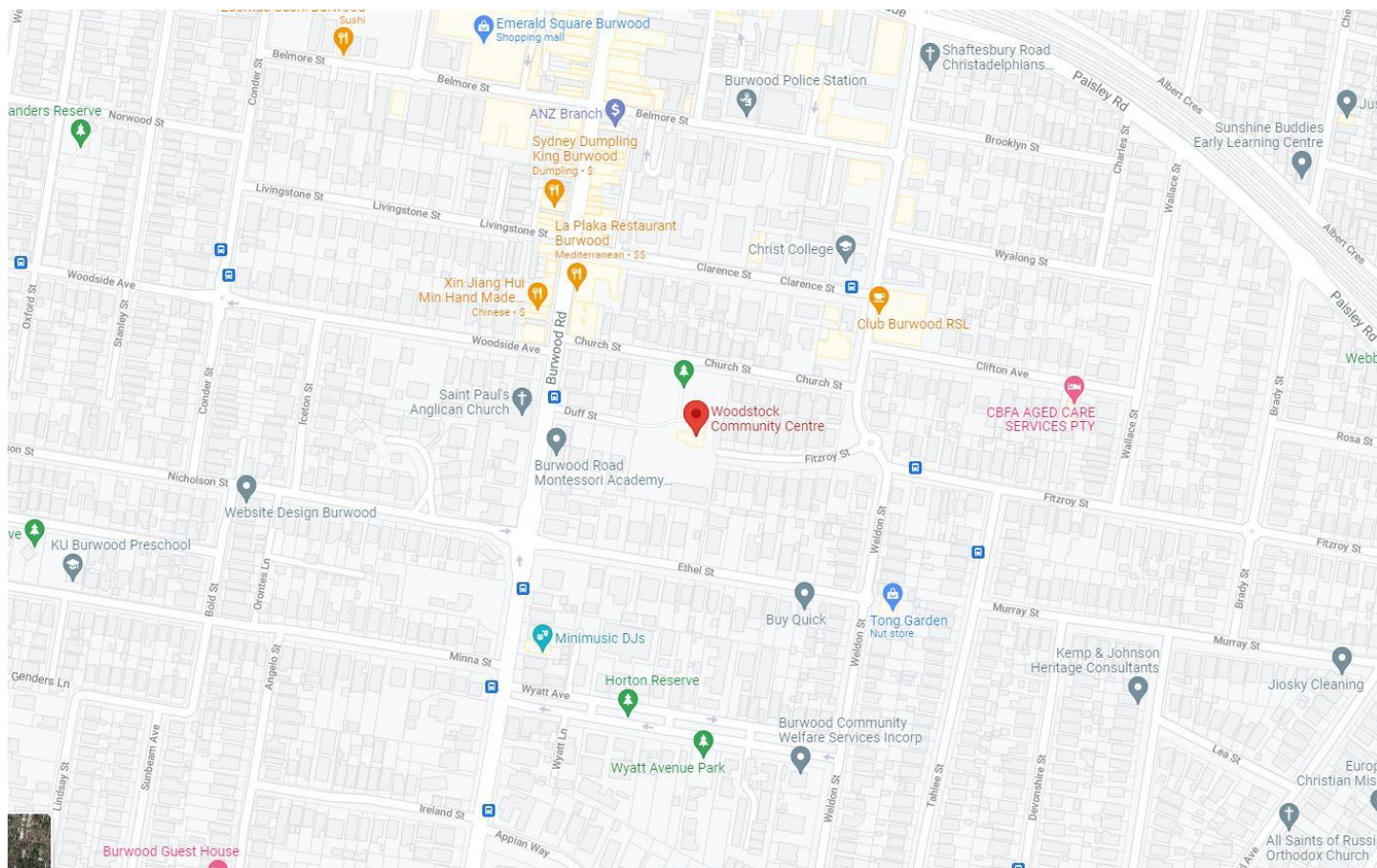

We hope you can attend one of our meetings and enjoy the fellowship of other enthusiasts for these wonderful plants.

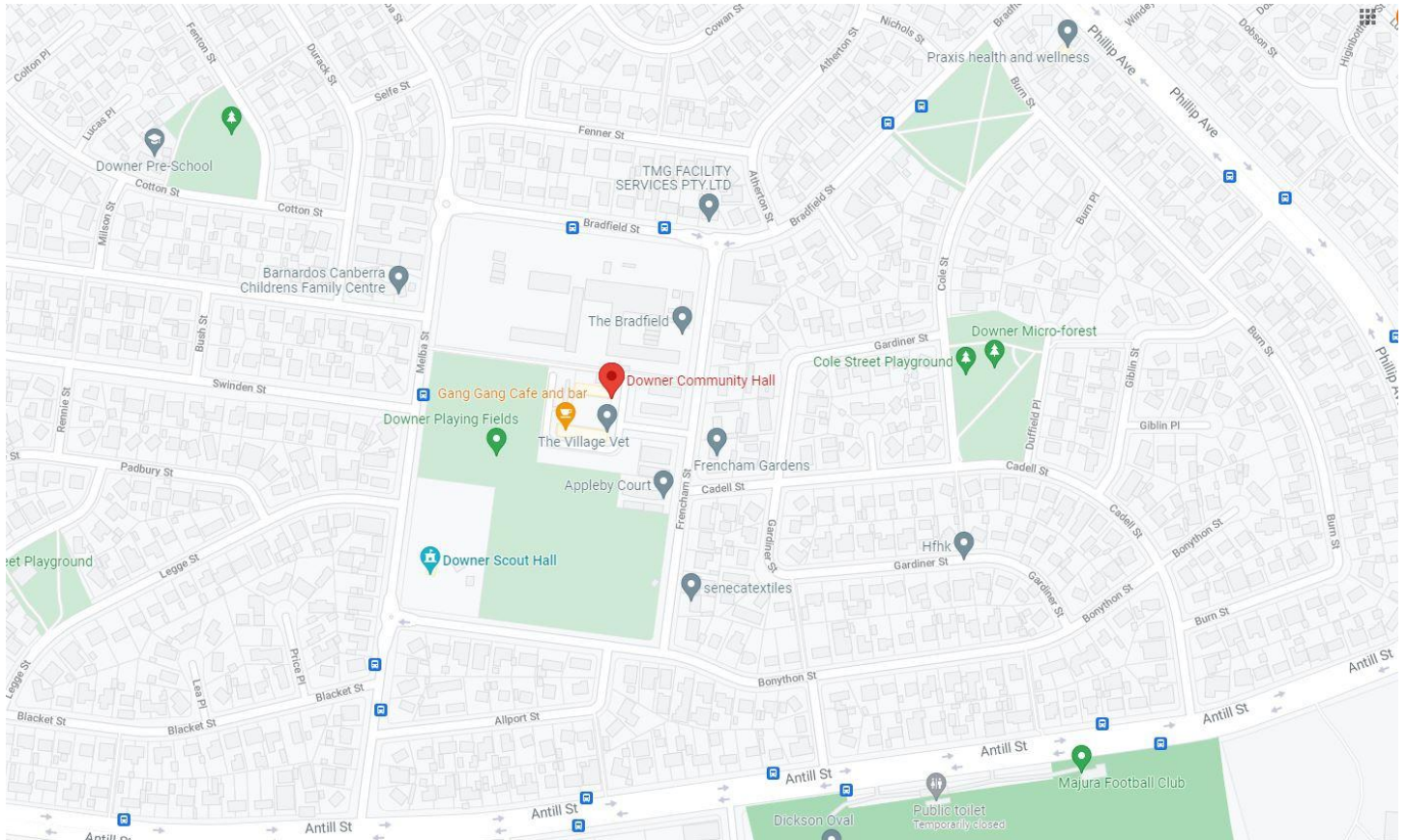
SYDNEY

CANBERRA

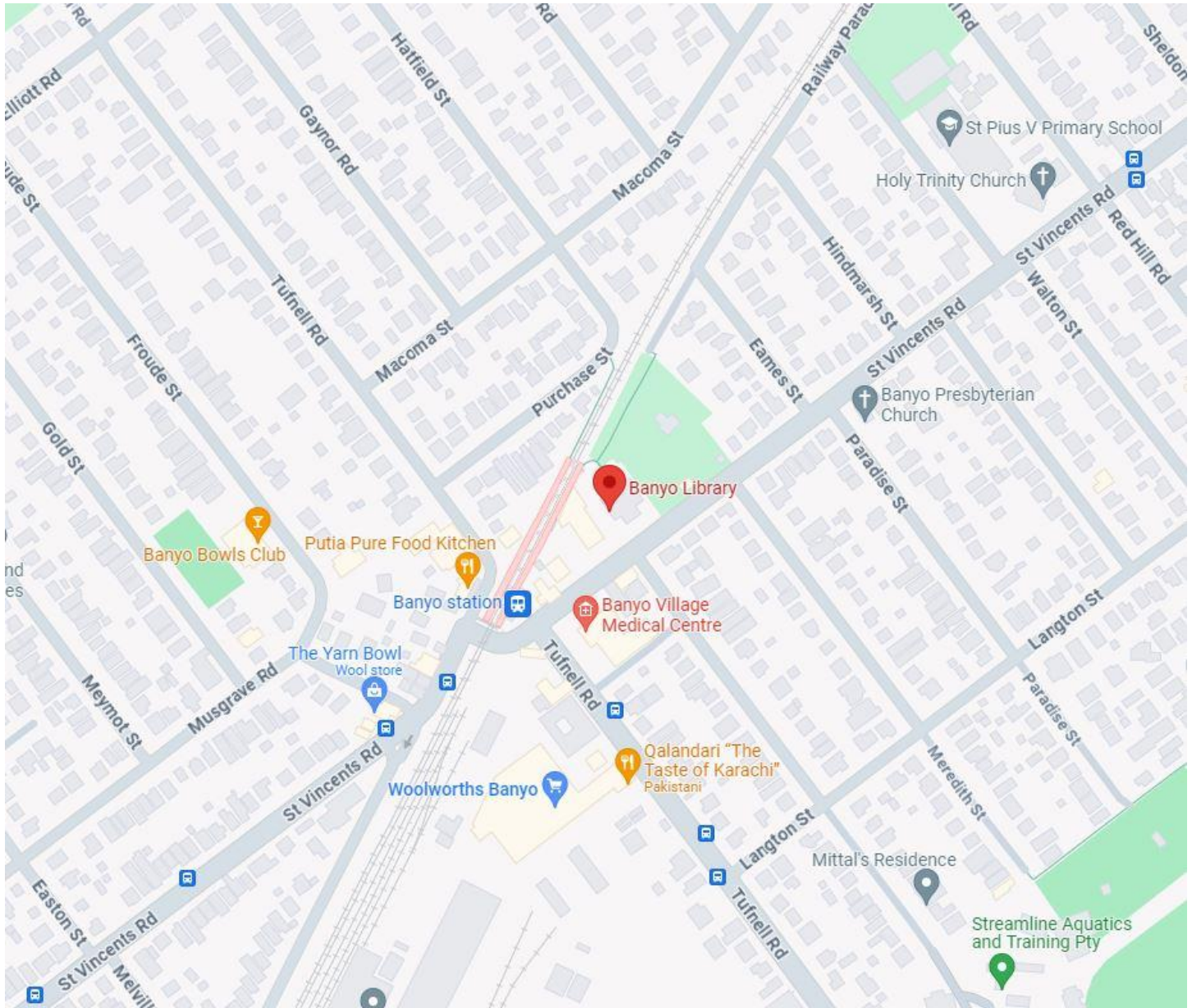

Australian Carnivorous Plants

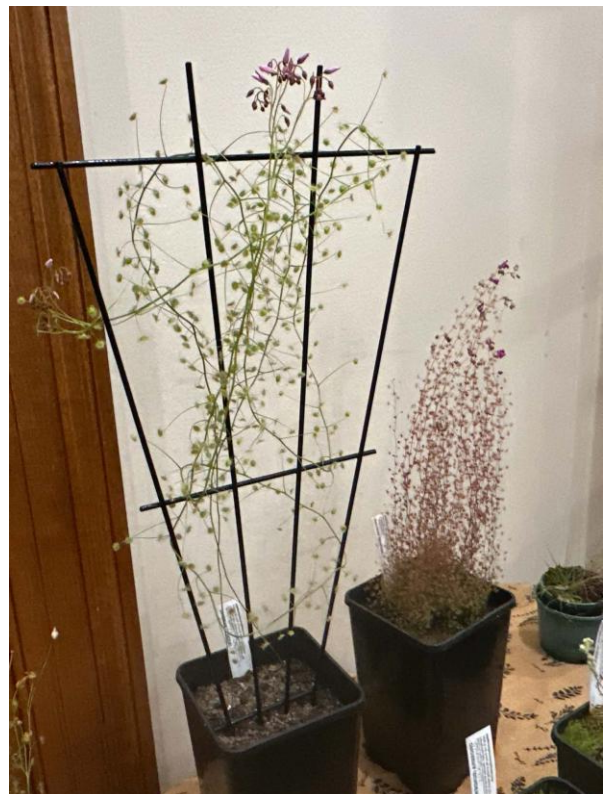
Species presented included: *Drosera binata*, *D. peltata*, *D. spatulata*, *D. auriculata*, *D. adae*, *D. menziesii*, *D. petiolaris*, *D. prolifera*, *D. broomensis*, *D. macrantha* (indumenta), *D. stolonifera*, *D. monantha*, *D. heterophylla*, *D. graniticola*, *D. lunata*, *D. paradoxa*, *D. ordensis*, *D. lowriei* (Giant), *D. rupicola*, *D. stricticaulis*, *D. gigantea*, *D. schizantha*; *Utricularia aurea*, *U. menziesii*; *Cephalotus* (green Dunnolly River and red forms).

- Medium: 60:40 peat/sand mix
- Grown indoors on a windowsill
- Watered via tray method, allowing the tray to dry between waterings

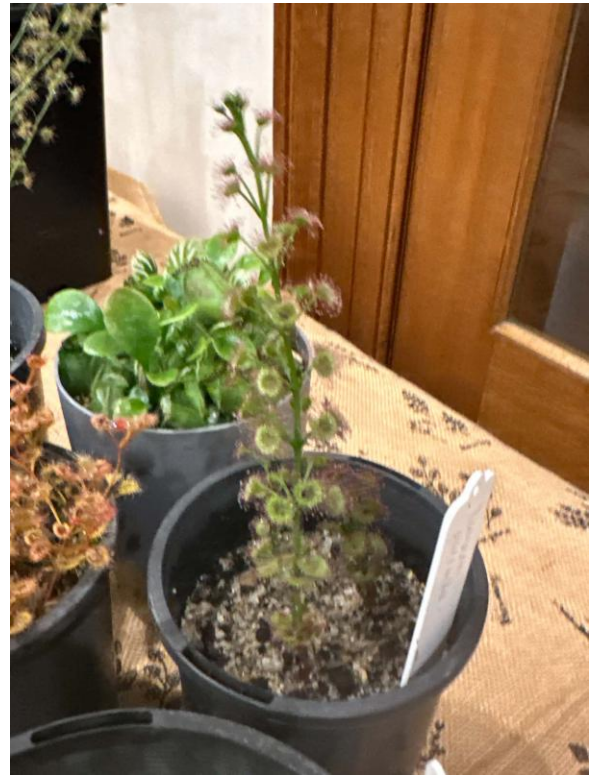

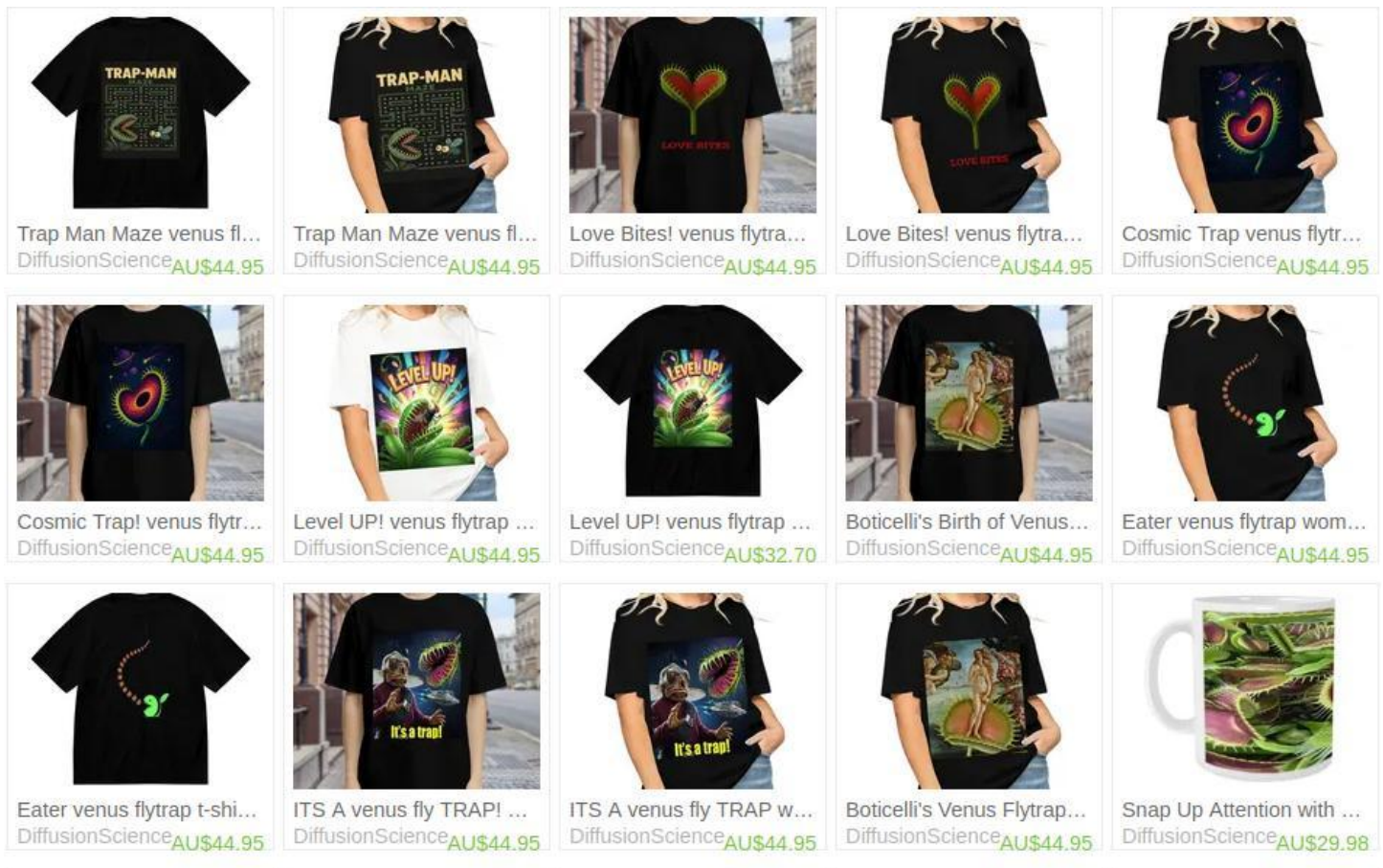

Early Spring – In the Greenhouse

General Seasonal Notes

Dormancy ends for many species as temperatures rise. Turions begin to grow and appear at the water surface. Increased light and careful moisture management are essential during this transition period.

Brocchinia / Catopsis

- Maintain **high light levels** and **high humidity**.
- Protect plants from frost.
- Feed with **¼-strength urea-free liquid fertiliser**.

Byblis

- *Byblis gigantea* and *B. lamellata* will be in full growth and beginning to flower.
- Cross-pollinate using the “**buzz**” technique.
- Keep soil consistently moist.
- Northern annual species may be sown now. Germination begins once temperatures reach **30°C** regularly.
- Artificial heat and/or **smoke or GA₃ treatment** can assist germination.

Cephalotus

- Keep soil **moist but well-drained**.
- Ensure **good air movement** to prevent fungal issues.
- Flowering typically occurs **mid to late Spring**.

Darlingtonia

- Dormancy ends and new growth begins.
- Keep plants moist and expose them to **cold temperatures for as long as possible**.
- Stratified seed will begin to germinate.

Dionaea (Venus Flytraps)

- Plants will resume growth with fresh leaves and flowers.
- Consider removing the flower spike and using it for **vegetative propagation**.

Drosera

Tuberous Drosera

- Approaching the end of their growth cycle; tall species are flowering.
- Pollinate flowers and keep pots moist.

Pygmy Drosera

- Producing new leaves; some species flowering.
- Keep plants moist to wet.

Winter-growing species (*D. ramentacea*, *D. cistiflora*, *D. pauciflora*)

- Actively growing and flowering.
- Maintain moist soil.

Tropical & Subtropical *Drosera*

- Actively growing; protect from frost.

Temperate *Drosera* (*D. filiformis*, *D. intermedia*, *D. rotundifolia*)

- Emerging from dormancy.

Drosophyllum

- Actively growing.
- Tolerates higher soil moisture during cooler months; tray watering is acceptable.
- Flowering begins in Spring; flowers are **self-fertile**.

Genlisea

- In active growth and flowering.
- Maintain **high water levels**.
- Protect from frost.

Heliamphora

- Keep plants in **bright, humid** conditions.
- Light levels may be increased with cooler nights.
- Feed with **¼-strength urea-free liquid fertiliser**.

Nepenthes

- Spring is an excellent growth period.
- **Lowland species:** Keep above **15°C**; leaf spotting indicates temperatures are too low.
- **Highland species:** Enjoy cooler nights; keep above **5°C**.

Pinguicula

Mexican species & hybrids

- Dormant; carnivorous summer leaves will appear soon.
- Keep soil drier.
- Non-carnivorous leaves may be used for **leaf cuttings**.

Warm-temperate species (*P. primuliflora*, *P. lusitanica*)

- Actively growing; flowering in Spring.
- Keep *P. primuliflora* well-watered and take leaf cuttings.

Roridula

- Actively growing; flowering occurs in winter and spring.
- Sow seed now on moist peat/sand.
- Germination takes **3–8 weeks**.
- Keep soil moist and provide **very bright light**.
- Ensure **good air circulation** to prevent fungal issues in seedlings.

Sarracenia

- All species and hybrids resume growth with fresh shoots and flowers.
- *S. flava* and *S. oreophila* look their best in Spring.
- Increase watering frequency and keep plants in **full sun**.

Utricularia

- Most terrestrial species are actively growing and flowering; keep moist to wet.
- Aquatic species resume growth and flowering.
- Winter-growing species (*U. multifida*, *U. menziesii*) are in active growth and flowering.
- Tropical species require **higher temperatures, humidity, and air movement**; keep soils moist.

POTTING MIXES

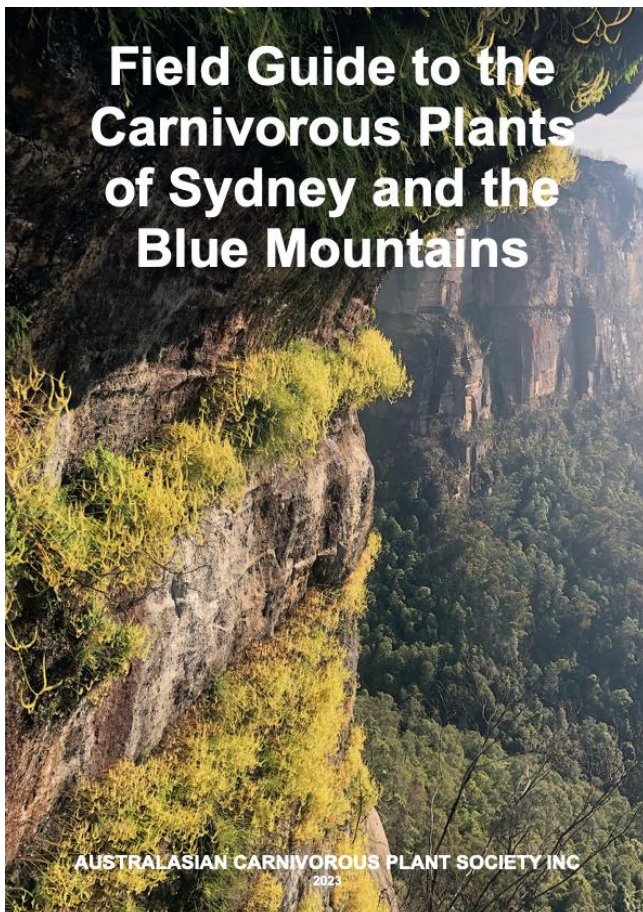
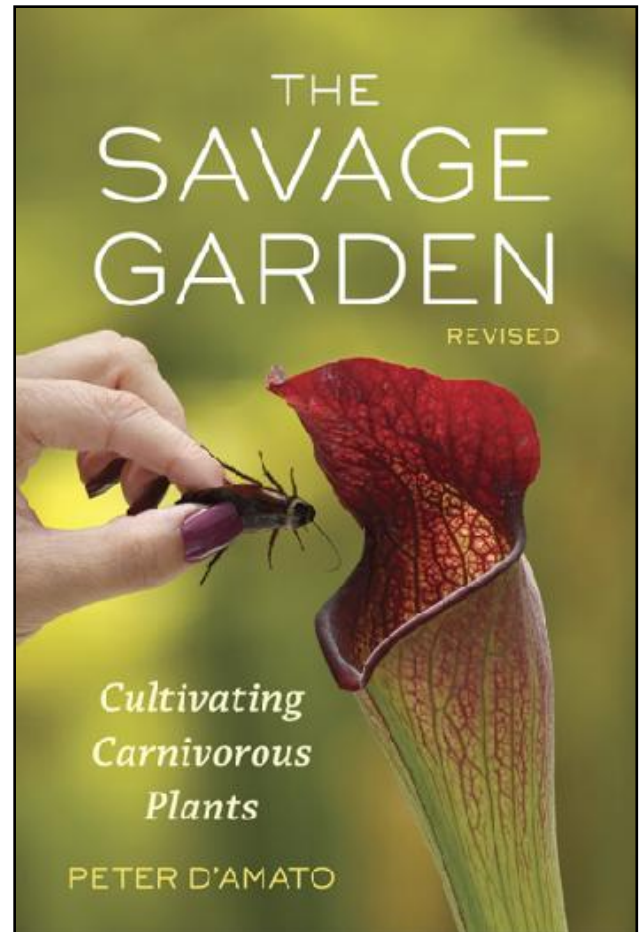
